We see this Mary three times, all of which she is at the feet of Jesus. And she did all that she could. And Jesus said she will remembered... She showed and gave extra gent love to prepare for Crist for his final sacrifice dying on the cross...This is what we as Christians call Easter...and was said of her that because she showed and gave extra gent love to prepare for Easter that when ever the Gospel was preached she would be remembered.

Mark 14:3-9 (NIV)

3 While he was in Bethany, reclining at the table in the home of a man known as Simon the Leper, - (SIMONTHE PHARISEE) a woman came with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume, made of pure nard. She broke the jar and poured the perfume on his head.

- 4 Some of those present were saying indignantly to one another, "Why this waste of perfume?
- 5 It could have been sold for more than a year's wages and the money given to the poor." And they rebuked her harshly.

Luke 10:38-42 (NIV) 38 As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, he came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to him. 39 She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what he said. 40 But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" 41 "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, 42 but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

- 42 Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he canceled the debts of both. Now which of them will love him more?"
 43 Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt canceled." "You have judged correctly," Jesus said.
- 44 Then he turned toward the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your house. You did not give me any water for my feet, but she wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair.
- 45 You did not give me a kiss, but this woman, from the time I entered, has not stopped kissing my feet.
- 46 You did not put oil on my head, but she has poured perfume on my feet.
- 47 Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven--for she loved much. But he who has been forgiven little loves little."
- 48 Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

John 11:1-6 (NIV)

I Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. 2 This Mary, whose brother Lazarus now lay sick, was the same one who poured perfume on the Lord and wiped his feet with her hair.

3 So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

4 When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it."

5 <u>Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.</u>
6 Yet when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days.

3 of David's Mighty Men.....2 Samuel 23...

15David had a craving and said, "Oh that someone would give me water to drink from the well of Bethlehem which is by the gate!" 16So the three mighty men broke through the camp of the Philistines, and drew water from the well of Bethlehem which was by the gate, and took it and brought it to David.
